Today, 26.9% of Ohioans live with a disability. Ohio has long been a leader in promoting technology for its citizens with disabilities. Funded by a statewide grant provided by the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities and administered by The Southern Ohio Council of Governments, the Ohio Tech Ambassador Network program will host almost twenty events through June 2023, some virtual and some in-person, to help others learn how adaptive technology use enhances lives and independence for people with developmental disabilities.
